The product data submitted with regard to the above has been considered and, subject to the following conditions, no objection is seen to the product being used for scale and corrosion control in potable water systems onboard United Kingdom registered ships.

- 1 The product specification in all respects is to be the same as that recorded with the Department and should not be varied unless prior agreement is obtained
- 2. The dosage of the product in the potable water system is not to exceed 25ppm.
- 3. This acceptance is based on the information supplied by the Manufacturer and is given on the understanding that Nalfleet Marine Chemicals Ltd. take full responsibility for providing, with all supplies of the product, a copy of these conditions of acceptance together with product data sheets and safety data sheets all for reference of the ship's personnel using the product
- 4. The Department's sole concern with this type of product is confined to possible harmful or toxic effects in the drinking water. the efficiency of the product has not been considered.

APPROVAL OF THE PRODUCT NALFLEET POTABLE WATER STABILISER FOR TREATMENT OF POTABLE WATER

We refer to Your letter dated 22 June 1994, ref. 200JHL/AH, concerning the approval of NALFLEET POTABLE WATER STABILISER for treatment of potable water on board ships and drilling rigs.

The National Institute of Public Health (NIPH) have the authority to approve products in contact with potable water on ship and off-shore installations. The manufacturer or the importer of such products are responsible for their product. The migration of components directly or indirectly from such products to potable water or food should not be greater than necessary for technological reasons. Furthermore migrating substances should pose no risk to human health. NIPH performs toxicological evaluations of such products which come in contact with potable water on land or food for the Norwegian Food Control Authority.

NIPH have evaluated toxicologically the product NALFLEET POTABLE WATER STABILISER and approved NALFLEET POTABLE WATER STABILISER for use in potable water supplies on ships and off-shore installations.

Premises for our evaluation and its use are that:

- 1) The product specification in all respects is to be the same as that recorded with the NIPH and should not be varied.
- 2) The product continues to meet the specifications of good manufacturing practices.
- 3) The dosage of the product in the potable water system is not to exceed 25 ppm.

This approval is based on the product information and chemical analyses given in your application and based on current knowledge. This may change. We must be informed concerning changes in the formulation. A new evaluation may then be necessary, and it may

result in a revocation of the approval. If essential changes are made in the formulation, this approval will be annulled automatically and a new application for approval will be necessary. Also if the basis for our evaluation of health is changed, the approval will be revoked.


Our opinion concerning the safety of the product does not constitute an endorsement, nor does it relate to its effectiveness for the intended use.

This approval is restricted to the effect on health. It is otherwise no guarantee for quality of the product and it should not be used in advertisements in a way that gives that impression. (Norwegian marketing regulation, law No. 47 of June 16th 1972, §2).


Charge of payment will be claimed Nalfleet Marine Chemicals according to Arbeidsmiljølovens §18 (Norwegian Working Environment Act, §18).

A complaint concerning this decision should be addressed to the Directorate of Health. Any complaint should be grounded and sent via National Institute of Public Health within 3 weeks.
